Anger and Harsh Words

I sat fuming: The words of someone I loved dearly had hurt to the core and broken my heart. Doing the same thing to them, I lashed back with those same hurtful words. I was angry and upset, and yes, bad thoughts were running rampant through my head.

Sometimes, we get angry and upset but it doesn't always mean it is right. I had been wrong to return fire in a volley of harsh words, causing strife on both sides. I knew I had to turn to God's Word - words I had read so many times, like this instance, did not heed the advice. The Holy Spirit led me to these verses:

Ephesians 4: 26-32 tells us:

²⁶ Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath:

²⁷ Neither give place to the devil.

²⁸ Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing, which is good, that he may have to give to him that needeth.

²⁹ Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers.

³⁰ And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

³¹ Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamor, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice.

³² And yea be kind to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

What did I learn?

First, I should have God's love in my heart always. Something not of God should not be coming out of my mouth or in my mind (harsh words and bad thoughts- because God knows all about them- (Prov. 15:3)

Second, I should not let the devil manipulate me, because in doing so, I grieved the Holy Spirit.

Third, I need to be careful about my witness. Others are always watching and listening. This includes God! What kind of witness am I being when I lose my temper and act in ways unpleasing to God?

Fourth, make things right. Swallow sinful pride and apologize- before the day ends. Ask God to give guidance on how to do this, so there is no more strife.

James 3:17-18 tells us: ¹⁷But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy." ¹⁸ And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.
