Coffee's Transformation and Ours

I still remember the first time I tasted coffee. I was a scrawny kid freezing at a football game and my older sister compassionately shared her java with me. That sip, however, was some of the bitterest stuff I'd ever tasted, and it was many years before I tried it again. In fact, it wasn't until I was in my mid-thirties that I retested this magnificent beverage. Since then, I've made up for lost time and now look forward to this blessed liquid every morning.

As I enjoy my starter fluid in a carefully selected mug from our eclectic collection, I've often thought about how simple and basic coffee is. Daily devotions give us that opportunity to sit in God's filter and allow our thoughts, emotions, dreams, ambitions, hurts, and desires to all percolate through the Scripture. As they do so, they are radically transformed into something that looks, smells, and tastes much better than before and they then, like coffee, can affect change in those with whom we interact!

Additionally, through prayer, we submit our minds to God's transforming presence with the Holy Spirit's influence, He can brew a cup of delight that puts a smile on His face and joy in our hearts.

In Psalm 34:8, David invites us to, "Taste and see that the Lord is good." Even if you've had a bad experience in the past, submit your dreams, desires, and ambitions to the transformative power of God's Word and allow Him to produce what He desires in you today.
